

Erasmus+

Erasmus+ is the new EU Programme for Education, Training, Youth and Sport. It is a follow-up of the former Lifelong Learning Programme (LLP) and it will run from 2014-2020. Erasmus+ is divided in three Key Actions:

- KA1: Learning Mobility for Individuals
- KA2: Co-operation and Innovations for Good Practices
- KA3: Support for Policy Reform

Participating countries are all 28 EU member countries, plus Iceland, Liechtenstein, Macedonia, Norway, Turkey and Switzerland. With the support of Erasmus+, participating institutions for higher education can sign Inter-Institutional Agreements on joint international activities.

Inter-Institutional Agreements

With the Erasmus+ option KA1: Learning Mobility for Individuals - Student Mobility, students have the possibility of spending a substantial study period abroad at one of the participating institutions with an Erasmus grant. The study periods are mainly meant for advanced students and are possible to spend during their Bachelor, Master and PhD studies.

The length of a study period abroad can take 3-12 months and varies per institution. The study period abroad is fully recognised as an integral part of the studies in the home institution.

The amount of an Erasmus grant depends on the length of the study period abroad and also on the living costs of the host institution's country: €150, €210 or €270 per month. An extra amount of €100 per month will be allocated to those students who will also do a placement (internship) during their Erasmus study period abroad. Students with financial support from their home country can continue using it during their study period abroad.

An Erasmus student will receive the following benefits:

- Placement in one of the participating music institutions without paying for any additional tuition: students only pay tuition fees to their home institution.
- Full recognition of the study period as an integral part of the overall course. As a confirmation of this, the host institution will issue a Transcript of Records for the student, as soon as the study period is completed.
- An Erasmus grant to help cover the extra expenses of studying abroad, such as travel expenses and higher costs of living in the host country.
- Assistance with the application procedures for placements in guest institutions abroad.
- In most cases, assistance from the host institution in finding accommodation.

Application procedure

Students of the Royal Conservatoire who are interested in a study period in the framework of Erasmus+, should apply to the Erasmus coordinator in the Royal Conservatoire. As part of this procedure, students will need permission from their teacher(s) and from their head of department.

In general, an Erasmus student application should consist of the following items:

- Student Application
- Learning Agreement
- Transcript of Records, preferably in English, to be printed from OSIRIS
- Curriculum Vitae
- Recording of around 20 minutes; for composition candidates: three (or four) scores, incl. sound recordings

When entering the requested study subjects in their Student Application and Learning Agreement, students are strongly advised to take the curriculum of the host institution as a reference and to mention the relevant study subject names and codes, as published in the website of the host institution (if available).

Students of the Royal Conservatoire who wish to apply for an Erasmus study period abroad should take the following into consideration:

- An increasing amount of institutions for higher musical education participates in the AEC online application system EASY, as developed by DreamApply: <https://aec.dreamapply.com>.
- The deadline for application can vary per institution abroad. Many institutions have an application deadline around March, prior to the academic year in which the study period will take place.
- In some cases, host institutions will invite students for a live audition. However, in most of the cases, a recording is sufficient.
- The procedure of assessment and selection can vary per host institution. In many cases, applications for an Erasmus study period will be considered parallel to regular applications. Acceptance of Erasmus exchange students is usually only possible if extra student places are available after regular applications in the same discipline have been considered. For this reason, the final result of an Erasmus application could be known relatively late. In general, the final result is known by 1 July at the latest, prior to the academic year in which the study period will take place.
- The Royal Conservatoire decides on the awarding of Erasmus scholarships.
